

Getting Your License Going to the DMV

Competition of Driver Education

Students are required by law to complete and pass 30 hours of classroom training. They must show knowledge of proper driving technique and behavior.

Students must also pass 6 hours of Behind-the-Wheel training with a certified driver education instructor.

After completing driver education, each student is reported to the state school board for approval to obtain a driver license. Their name and license number is processed electronically. To see if your son or daughter has been approved go to the following website: www.isbe.net then click on **Students** on the toolbar, scroll down to **Programs** and click on **Driver Education Student License Inquiry**. When that page opens, type the student's license number and press search. If not approved, call an instructor.

What to take to the DMV

When taking your son or daughter to get their license, make sure they have a qualified vehicle to take the drive test. Also,

1. Approval (done online)
2. Instruction permit
3. 25 hour parent log
4. Certified birth certificate
5. Social Security Card
6. At least one other form of ID (bank statement or recent mail with name and address)
7. If qualified for COOP Testing (A and B students only); a test certificate.

Spot Checks

A and B students may be required to take a drive test through a process call a **Spot Check**. These are random checks as determined by the Secretary of State. Those dates are not available to the driver education instructors. So be prepared to take a road test and have a qualified vehicle available.

All students whose grade is less than a B **must** pass a road test administered at the DMV in order to get their license.
